

#### Invitation to Bids

1. This Invitation to Bids follows the Procurement Notice for the subject Project/Procurement which appeared on **NBP** and **PPRA** Websites.
2. The National Bank of Pakistan has reserved the funds for the procurement planned during the financial year 2025. It is intended that part of the proceeds of the fund will be used to cover eligible payment under the contract for the aforesaid procurement.
3. The National Bank of Pakistan; now invites bids from eligible Suppliers for Procurement of 2.5KVA UPS with Batteries with related Services; **through EPADS only**.
4. This is a “Single Stage-One Envelope Bidding Procedure” as per Rule 36 (a) of Public Procurement Rules 2004 under PPRA and any Regulations, Regulatory Guides, Procurement Guidelines or Instructions issued by the Authority (from time to time) and is open to all potential bidders.
5. All bids must be accompanied by a scanned Copy of Bid Security in the form of Banker’s Cheque or Payment Order or Bank Guarantee in the amount of **RS. 600,000 /-**. The ORIGINAL BID SECURITY MUST be submitted to the National Bank of Pakistan any time before the Closing time of Bid Submission, failing which the bid shall be rejected.
6. The original bid, along with all the required documents as stated in the bidding documents; properly filled in, must be submitted ONLY through e-Pak Acquisition & Disposal System (EPADS) at or before **12:00 AM** dated: **26<sup>th</sup> December 2024**. The bids will be opened promptly thereafter on **EPADS at 12:30 AM** the same day, and in the presence of bidders’ representatives who choose to attend in the opening at the under mentioned address.

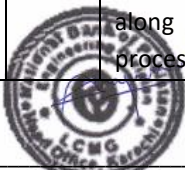

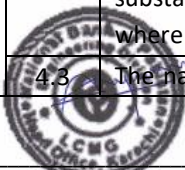
**A - INTRODUCTION**

<b>1. Scope of Bid</b>	.1.1.	The Procuring Agency (PA), as indicated in the <b>Bid Data Sheet</b> (BDS) hereinafter referred to as “ <b>NBP</b> ” invites Bids for the provision of Goods as specified in the BDS and <b>Section V – Schedule of Requirements &amp; Technical Specifications</b> . The successful Bidders will be expected to deliver the goods within the specified period and timeline(s) as stated in the <b>BDS</b> .
	.1.2.	Bidders must quote for the complete Scope of the Works as per Appendix A to Bid and details of works specified in the Bill of Quantities. Any Bid not covering complete Scope of the Works will be declared as “non-responsive” and will be “Rejected” readily
	.1.3.	In pursuant to Sub Clause ITB.1.1, the successful bidder i.e. the “Most Advantageous Bidder”; to be declared in accordance to Clause ITB.34 will be expected to complete the Works within the Completion Period as specified in BDS.
<b>2. Sources of Funds</b>	2.1	Sources of funds is referred in Clause-2 of Invitation to Bids
<b>3. Eligible Bidders</b>	3.1	A Bidder may be natural person, company or firm or public or semi-public agency of Pakistan or any foreign country, or any combination of them with a formal existing agreement (on Judicial Papers) in the form of a joint venture, consortium, or association. In the case of a joint venture, consortium, or association, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the Contract in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract. The joint venture, consortium, or association shall nominate a Lead Member as nominated in the BDS, who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the joint venture, consortium, or association during the Bidding process, and in case of award of contract, during the execution of contract.  <i>(The limit on the number of members of JV or Consortium or Association may be prescribed in BDS, in accordance with the guidelines issued by the PPRA).</i>
	3.2	The appointment of Lead Member in the joint venture, consortium, or association shall be confirmed by submission of a valid Power of Attorney to the <b>NBP</b> .
	3.3	Verifiable copy of the agreement that forms a joint venture, consortium or association shall be required to be submitted as part of the Bid.
	3.4	Any bid submitted by the joint venture, consortium or association shall indicate the part of proposed contract to be performed by each party and each party shall be evaluated (or post qualified if required) with respect to its contribution only, and the responsibilities of each party shall not be substantially altered without prior written approval of the <b>NBP</b> and in line with any instructions issued by the Authority.
	3.5	The invitation for Bids is open to all prospective supplier, manufacturers or authorized agents/dealers subject to any provisions of incorporation or licensing by the respective national incorporating agency or statutory body established for that particular trade or business.
	3.6	Foreign Bidders must be locally registered with the appropriate national incorporating body or the statutory body, before participating in the national/international competitive tendering with the exception of such procurements made by the foreign missions of Pakistan. For such purpose the bidder must have to initiate the registration process before the bid submission and the necessary evidence shall be submitted to the <b>NBP</b> along with their bid, however, the final award will be subject to the complete registration process.

	3.7	<p><b>A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All Bidders found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. A Bidders may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this Bidding process, if they:</b></p> <p>a) are associated or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the <b>NBP</b> to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under this Invitation for Bids.</p> <p>b) have controlling shareholders in common; or</p> <p>c) receive or have received any direct or indirect subsidy from any of them; or</p> <p>d) have the same legal representative for purposes of this Bid; or</p> <p>e) have a relationship with each other, directly or through common third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the Bid of another Bidder or influence the decisions of the <b>NBP</b> regarding this Bidding process.</p> <p align="center"><b>“OR”</b></p> <p>f) Submit more than one bid in this Bidding process.</p>
	3.8	<p><b>A Bidder may be ineligible if –</b></p> <p>a) he is declared bankrupt or, in the case of company or firm, insolvent.</p> <p>b) payments in favor of the Bidder is suspended in accordance with the judgment of a court of law other than a judgment declaring bankruptcy and resulting (in accordance with the national laws) in the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of its property;</p> <p>c) legal proceedings are instituted against such Bidder involving an order suspending payments and which may result, in accordance with the national laws, in a declaration of bankruptcy or in any other situation entailing the total or partial loss of the right to administer and dispose of the property.</p> <p>d) the Bidder is convicted, by a final judgment, of any offence involving professional conduct.</p> <p>e) the Bidder is blacklisted and hence debarred due to involvement in corrupt and fraudulent practices, or performance failure or due to breach of bid securing declaration.</p> <p>f) The firm, supplier and contractor is blacklisted or debarred by a foreign country, international organization, or other foreign institutions for the period defined by them.</p>
	3.9	Bidders shall provide to the <b>NBP</b> evidence of their eligibility, proof of compliance with the necessary legal requirements to carry out the contract effectively.
	3.10	Bidders shall provide such evidence of their continued eligibility to the satisfaction of the <b>NBP</b> , as the <b>NBP</b> shall reasonably request.
	3.11	Bidders shall submit proposals relating to the nature, conditions and modalities of sub-contracting wherever the sub-contracting of any elements of the contract amounting to the more than ten (10) percent of the Bid price is envisaged.
<p><b>4. Eligible Goods &amp; Related Services</b></p>	4.1	All goods and related services to be supplied under the contract shall have their origin in eligible source countries, and all expenditures made under the contract will be limited to such goods and services. For purpose of this Bid, ineligible countries are stated in the section-4 titled as “Eligible Countries”.
	4.2	For purposes of this Clause, “origin” means the place where the goods are mined, grown, cultivated, produced, manufactured, or processed, or through manufacture, procession, or assembly, another commercially recognized article results that differs substantially in its basic characteristics from its imported components or the place from where the related services are/to be supplied.
	4.3	The nationality of the supplier that supplies, assembles, distributes, or sells the goods and



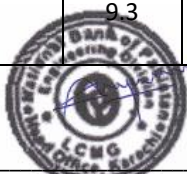

		services shall not determine the origin of the goods.
	4.4	To establish the eligibility of the Goods and the related services, Bidders shall fill the country-of-origin declarations included in the Form of Bid.
	4.5	If so required in the <b>BDS</b> , the Bidder shall demonstrate that it has been duly authorized by the manufacturer of the goods to deliver in Pakistan (or in respective country in case of procurement by the Pakistani Missions abroad), the goods indicated in its Bid.
<b>5. One Bid per Bidder</b>	5.1	A bidder shall submit only one Bid, in the same bidding process, either individually as a Bidder or as a member in a joint venture or any similar arrangement.
	5.2	No bidder can be a sub-contractor while submitting a Bid individually or as a member of a joint venture in the same Bidding process.
	5.3	A person or a firm cannot be a sub-contractor with more than one bidder in the same bidding process.
<b>6. Cost of Bidding</b>	6.1	The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Bid, and the <b>NBP</b> shall in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.
	6.2	Since it is mandatory to submit the bidding documents only by uploading on the PPRA's EPADS Portal; it is understood that the bidder will do so through his registered EPADS account; and such action will bind and commit the bidder to own his respective submission
	6.3	However; the Employer may ask the bidder; to submit necessary authorization letter or power of attorney or any other documentary proof/evidence for the authorized Signatory of the Bid; if require during the preliminary examination and evaluation of the bids.



**B – BIDDING DOCUMENTS**

<b>7. Contents of Bidding Documents</b>	7.1	The goods required, bidding procedures, and terms and conditions of the contract are prescribed in the Bidding Documents. In addition to the Invitation to Bids, the Bidding Documents which should be read in conjunction with any addenda issued in accordance with ITB 9.2 include: <b>Section I</b> -Invitation to Bids <b>Section II</b> Instructions to Bidders (ITB) <b>Section III</b> Bid Data Sheet (BDS) <b>Section IV</b> Eligible Countries <b>Section V</b> Technical Specifications, Schedule of Requirements <b>Section VI</b> Standard Forms of Bid <b>Section VII</b> General Conditions of Contract (GCC) <b>Section VIII</b> Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) <b>Section IX</b> Contract Forms
	7.2	The number of copies to be completed and returned with the Bid is specified in the <b>BDS</b> .
	7.3	The <b>NBP</b> is not responsible for the completeness of the Bidding Documents and their addenda, if they were not downloaded from the website of the <b>NBP</b> or EPADS.
	7.4	The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the Bidding Documents. Failure to furnish all the information required in the Bidding Documents will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in the rejection of his Bid.
<b>8. Clarification of Bidding Documents</b>	8.1	A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Documents may notify the <b>NBP</b> ; in writing through <b>EPADS</b> that provides record of the content of communication at the <b>NBP's</b> address indicated in the <b>BDS</b> .
	8.2	The <b>NBP</b> will within Three (03) working days after receiving the request for clarification, respond in writing or in electronic form to any request for clarification provided that such request is received not later than Three (03) working days prior to the deadline for the submission of Bids as prescribed in <b>ITB 23.1</b> . However, this clause shall not apply in case of alternate methods of Procurement.
	8.3	Copies of the <b>NBP's</b> response will be forwarded to all identified Prospective Bidders through an identified source of communication i.e. <b>EPADS</b> , including a description of the inquiry, but without identifying its source. In case of downloading of the Bidding Documents from the website of PPRA, the response of all such queries will also be available on the same link available at the website. – <b>Note: All responses will only be processed through EPADS.</b>
	8.4	Should the <b>NBP</b> deem it necessary to amend the Bidding Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under <b>ITB 9</b> .
<b>9. Amendment of Bidding Documents</b>	9.1	Before the deadline for submission of Bids, the <b>NBP</b> for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder or pre-Bid meeting may modify the Bidding Documents by issuing addenda.
	9.2	The Employer is not responsible for the completeness of the Bidding Documents and their addenda, if they were not properly downloaded by the bidder from the PPRA's EPADS Portal or the bidder has failed to upload the completed bidding documents along with other necessary documents as specified in the bidding documents on the PPRA's EPADS Portal.
	9.3	Any addendum issued including the notice of any extension of the deadline shall be part of the Bidding Documents pursuant to <b>ITB 7.1</b> and shall be communicated in writing or in any identified electronic form that provide record of the content of

		<p>communication to all the bidders who have obtained the Bidding Documents from the <b>NBP</b>. The <b>NBP</b> shall promptly publish the Addendum at the <b>NBP</b>'s web page identified in the BDS:</p> <p>Provided that the bidder who had either already submitted their bid or handed over the bid to the courier prior to the issuance of any such addendum shall have the right to withdraw his already filed bid and submit the revised bid prior to the original or extended bid submission deadline.</p>
	9.4	<p>To give prospective Bidders reasonable time in which to take an addendum/corrigendum into account in preparing their Bids, the <b>NBP</b> may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Bids:</p> <p>Provided that the <b>NBP</b> shall extend the deadline for submission of Bid, if such an addendum is issued within last three (03) working days of the Bid submission deadline.</p>
<b>10. Clarification of Bidding Documents &amp; Pre-Bid Meeting</b>	<b>10.1</b>	<p>Any prospective bidder requiring any clarification(s) in the Bidding Documents may notify the Employer in writing through PPRA's EPADS Portal. The Employer within number of working days as specified in the BDS after receiving the request for clarifications will respond in writing through PPRA's EPADS Portal to any request for clarifications, provided that such notifications/requests is received not later than number of days as specified in the BDS prior to the deadline for the submission date of Bids as prescribed in Notice for Invitation for Bids</p>
	<b>10.2</b>	<p>Employer's response(s) to the clarification(s); will be made available to all the identified prospective bidders at PPRA's EPADS Portal; including a description of the inquiry, but without identifying its source; as per PPRA's policy</p>
	<b>10.3</b>	<p>If a Pre-Bid Meeting is proposed for the prospective bidders, then the place, date and time will be mentioned in the Notice for Invitation for bids. The Bidder's designated representative is invited at the Bidder's cost to attend. The purpose of the meeting will be to clarify issues and answer questions on the technical requirements, Evaluation Criteria or any other aspects of the bidding documents</p>
	<b>10.4</b>	<p>Minutes of the pre-Bid meeting, if held in pursuant to Sub Clause ITB.10.3, including the text of the questions asked by Bidders, including those during the meeting (without identifying the source) and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be uploaded on PPRA's EPADS Portal</p>
	<b>10.5</b>	<p>Any modifications to the Bidding Documents listed in Sub Clause ITB 9.1, which may become necessary as a result of the Clarifications or Pre-Bid Meeting, shall be made by the Employer exclusively through the use of an Addendum following the procedure under Clause ITB.11. Non - attendance at the pre-Bid meeting will not be a cause for disqualification of a Bidder</p>
	<b>10.6</b>	<p>Under the provision of Rule 48 of PPR 2004, if a Bidder feels that any provision in the documents is contrary to the provisions of procurement regulatory framework, such issue should be raised as soon as possible. Any party may file its written complaint against the eligibility parameters, evaluation criteria, or any other terms and conditions prescribed in the Bidding Documents, if found contrary to the provisions of the procurement regulatory framework, the same shall be addressed by the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) well before the Bid submission deadline. **C – PREPARATION OF BIDS**

<b>11. Amendment of Bidding Documents</b>	11.1	At any time prior to the deadline for submission of bids, the Employer may, for any reason, whether at his own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective bidder or resulted due to discussions made during the pre-Bid meeting, modify the Bidding Documents by issuing addendum. Such amendments shall take precedence over the existing bidding documents.
	11.2	Any addendum thus issued including the notice of any extension of the deadline shall be part of the Bidding Documents pursuant to Sub Clause ITB.11.1 and shall be communicated in writing or in any identified electronic form that provide record of the content of communication. The Employer shall promptly publish the Addendum at PPRA’s EPADS Portal or at its Website: <a href="http://www.nbp.com.pk">http://www.nbp.com.pk</a> as well Provided that the bidder who had either already submitted their bid on PPRA’s EPADS Portal prior to the issuance of any such addendum shall have the right to withdraw his already filed bid and submit the revised bid prior to the original or extended bid submission deadline; provided the PPRA’s EPADS Portal allow him to do so
	11.3	The addendum will be binding on Bidders. It will be assumed that the amendments contained in such Addendum have been taken into account by the Bidder in its bid.
	11.4	To give prospective bidders reasonable time in which to take an addendum/corrigendum into account in preparing their Bids, the Employer may at its discretion extend the deadline for the submission of Bids in accordance with Clause ITB.25, consistent with the provisions under Rule 27 of PPR-2004. Provided that the Employer shall extend the deadline for submission of Bid, if such an addendum is issued within last number of days (as specified in the BDS) prior to the Bid submission deadline
<b>12 Language of Bid</b>	12.1	The Bid prepared by the Bidder, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the Bid exchanged by the Bidder and the <b>NBP</b> shall be written in the English language unless specified in the BDS. Supporting documents and printed literature furnished by the Bidder may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant pages in the English language unless specified in the BDS, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Bidder, the translation shall govern.
<b>13. Documents and Samples(s) Constituting the Bid</b>	13.1	The Bid prepared by the Bidder shall constitute the following components: - a) Form of Bid and Bid Prices completed in accordance with <b>ITB 14 and 15</b> ; b) Details of the Sample(s) where applicable and requested in the <b>BDS</b> . c) Documentary evidence established in accordance with <b>ITB 13</b> that



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		<p>the Bidder is eligible and/or qualified for the subject bidding process.</p> <p>d) Documentary evidence established in accordance with <b>ITB 13.3(a)</b> that the Bidder has been authorized by the manufacturer to deliver the goods into Pakistan, where required and where the supplier is not the manufacturer of those goods.</p> <p>e) Documentary evidence established in accordance with ITB 12 that the goods and related services to be supplied by the Bidder are eligible goods and services and conform to the Bidding Documents.</p> <p>f) Bid security or Bid Securing Declaration furnished in accordance with <b>ITB 18;</b></p> <p>g) Duly Notarized Power of Attorney authorizing the signatory of the Bidder to submit the bid; and</p> <p>h) Any other document required in the <b>BDS.</b></p>
	13.2	<p>Where a sample(s) is required by a <b>NBP</b>, the sample shall be:</p> <p>a) submitted as part of the bid, in the quantities, dimensions and other details requested in the <b>BDS.</b></p> <p>b) carriage paid.</p> <p>c) received on, or before, the closing time and date for the submission of bids; and</p> <p>d) evaluated to determine compliance with all characteristics listed in the <b>BDS.</b></p>
	13.3	<p>The <b>NBP</b> shall retain the sample(s) of the successful Bidder. A <b>NBP</b> shall reject the Bid if the sample(s)-</p> <p>a) do(es) not conform to all characteristics prescribed in the bidding documents; and</p> <p>b) is/are not submitted through EPADS within the specified time clearly mentioned in the Bid Data Sheet.</p>
	13.4	<p>Where it is not possible to avoid using a propriety article as a sample, a Bidder shall make it clear that the propriety article is displayed only as an example of the type or quality of the goods being Bided for, and that competition shall not thereby belimited to the extent of that article only.</p>
	13.5	<p>Samples made up from materials supplied by a <b>NBP</b> shall not be returned to a Bidder nor shall a <b>NBP</b> be liable for the cost of making them.</p>
	13.6	<p>All samples produced from materials belonging to an unsuccessful Bidder shall be kept by the <b>NBP</b> till thirty (30) calendar days from the date of award of contract or exhaust of all the grievance forums (including those pending at Authority’s Level or in some Court of Law).</p>





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<b>14. Documents Establishing Eligibility of Goods and Related Services and Conformity to Bidding Documents</b>	14.1	Pursuant to <b>ITB 11</b> , the Bidder shall furnish, as part of its Bid, all those documents establishing the eligibility in conformity to the terms and conditions specified in the Bidding Documents for all goods and related services which the Bidder proposes to deliver.

	14.5	For purposes of the commentary to be furnished pursuant to <b>ITB 12.3(c)</b> above, the Bidder shall note that standards for workmanship, material, and equipment, as well as references to brand names or catalogue numbers designated by the <b>NBP</b> in its Technical Specifications, are intended to be descriptive only and not restrictive. The Bidder may substitute alternative standards, brand names, and/or catalogue numbers in its Bid, provided that it demonstrates to the <b>NBP's</b> satisfaction that the substitutions ensure substantial equivalence to those designated in the Technical Specifications.

	20.6	Any Bid not accompanied by a Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration in accordance with <b>ITB 18.1</b> or <b>18.3</b> shall be rejected by the <b>NBP</b> as non- responsive, pursuant to <b>ITB 28</b> .
	20.7	<p>Unsuccessful Bidders’ Bid Security will be discharged or returned as promptly as possible, however in no case later than thirty (30) calendar days after the expiration of the period of Bid Validity prescribed by the <b>NBP</b> pursuant to <b>ITB 17</b>. 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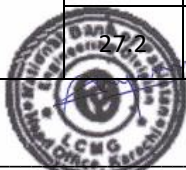

	22.2	Bids requested to be withdrawn in accordance with <b>ITB 20.1</b> shall be returned unopened to the Bidders.
<b>23. Format and Signing of Bid</b>	23.1	The Bidder shall prepare an original and the number of copies of the Bid as indicated in the BDS, clearly marking each “ORIGINAL” and “COPY,” as appropriate. **D – SUBMISSION OF BIDS (ELETRONICALLY ON EPADS)**

	24.2	The inner and outer envelopes shall: a) be addressed to the <b>NBP</b> at the address given in the BDS; and b) bear the title of the subject procurement or Project name, as the case may be as indicated in the BDS, the Invitation to Bids (ITB) title and number indicated in the BDS, and a statement: “DO NOT OPEN BEFORE,” to be completed with the time and the date specified in the BDS, pursuant to ITB 23.1.
	24.3	In case of Single Stage Two Envelope Procedure, The Bid shall comprise two envelopes submitted simultaneously, one called the Technical Proposal and the other Financial Proposal. Both envelopes to be enclosed together in an outer single envelope called the Bid. Each Bidder shall submit his bid as under: a) Bidder shall submit his <b>TECHNICAL PROPOSAL</b> and <b>FINANCIAL PROPOSAL</b> in separate inner envelopes and enclosed in a single outer envelope. b) <b>ORIGINAL</b> and each copy of the Bid shall be separately sealed and put in separate envelopes and marked as such. c) The envelopes containing the <b>ORIGINAL</b> and copies will be put in one sealed envelope and addressed / identified as given in Sub- Clause 21.2.
	24.4	The inner and outer envelopes shall: a) be addressed to the <b>NBP</b> at the address provided in the Bidding Data. b) bear the name and identification number of the contract as defined in the Bidding Data; and provide a warning not to open before the time and date for bid opening, as specified in the Bidding Data. pursuant to ITB 23.1. c) In addition to the identification required in Sub- Clause 21.2 hereof, the inner envelope shall indicate the name and address of the bidder to enable the bid to be returned unopened in case it is declared “late” pursuant to Clause IB.24
	24.5	If all envelopes are not sealed and marked as required by ITB 22.2, ITB 22.3 and ITB 22.4 or incorrectly marked, the <b>NBP</b> will assume no responsibility for the misplacement or premature opening of Bid.
	<b>25. Deadline for Submission of Bids</b>	25.1
25.2		The <b>NBP</b> may, in exceptional circumstances and at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Bids by amending the Bidding Documents in accordance with ITB 9, in which case all rights and obligations of the <b>NBP</b> and Bidders previously subject to the deadline will thereafter be subject to the new deadline.
<b>26. Late Bids</b>	26.1	The <b>NBP</b> shall not consider for evaluation any Bid that arrives after the deadline for submission of Bids, in accordance with <b>ITB 23</b> .
	26.2	Any Bid received by the <b>NBP</b> after the deadline for submission of Bids shall be declared late, recorded, rejected and returned unopened to the Bidder.
<b>27. Withdrawal of Bids</b>	27.1	A Bidder may withdraw its Bid after it has been submitted, provided that written notice of the withdrawal of the Bid, is received by the <b>NBP</b> prior to the deadline for submission of Bids.
	27.2	Revised bid may be submitted after the withdrawal of the original bid in accordance with the provisions referred in ITB 22.



**E – OPENING AND EVALUATION OF BIDS**

<b>28. Opening of Bids</b>	28.1	The <b>NBP</b> will open all Bids through EPADS, in the presence of Bidders’ or their representatives who choose to attend, and other parties with a legitimate interest in the Bid proceedings at the place, on the date and at the time, specified in the BDS. The Bidders’ representatives present shall sign a register as proof of their attendance.
	28.2	First, envelopes marked “WITHDRAWAL” shall be opened and read out and the envelope with the corresponding bid shall not be opened but returned to the Bidder. No bid withdrawal shall be permitted unless the corresponding Withdrawal Notice contains a valid authorization to request the withdrawal and is read out at bid opening.
	28.3	Second, outer envelopes marked “SUBSTITUTION” shall be opened. The inner envelopes containing the Substitution Bid shall be exchanged for the corresponding Original Bid being substituted, which is to be returned to the Bidder unopened. No envelope shall be substituted unless the corresponding Substitution Notice contains a valid authorization to request the substitution and is read out and recorded at bid opening.
	28.4	Next, outer envelopes marked “MODIFICATION” shall be opened. No Technical Proposal and/or Financial Proposal shall be modified unless the corresponding Modification Notice contains a valid authorization to request the modification and is read out and recorded at the opening of the Bids. Any Modification shall be read out along with the Original Bid except in case of Single Stage Two Envelope Procedure where only the Technical Proposal, both Original as well as Modification, are to be opened, read out, and recorded at the opening. Financial Proposal, both Original and Modification, will remain unopened till the prescribed financial bid opening date.
	28.5	Other envelopes holding the Bids shall be opened one at a time, in case of Single Stage-One Envelope Procedure, the Bidders names, the Bid prices, the total amount of each Bid and of any alternative Bid (if alternatives have been requested or permitted), any discounts, the presence or absence of Bid Security, Bid Securing Declaration and such other details as the <b>NBP</b> may consider appropriate, will be announced by the Procurement Evaluation Committee.
	28.6	In case of Single Stage Two Envelope Procedure, the <b>NBP</b> will open the Technical Proposals electronically through PPRA EPADS, in public at the address, date and time specified in the BDS in the presence of Bidders’ designated representatives who choose to attend and other parties with a legitimate interest in the Bid proceedings. The Financial Proposals will remain unopened and will be held in custody of the <b>NBP</b> until the specified time of their opening.
	28.7	The envelopes holding the Technical Proposals shall be opened one at a time, and the following read out and recorded: (a) the name of the Bidder; (b) whether there is a modification or substitution; (c) the presence of a Bid Security, if required; and (d) Any other details as the <b>NBP</b> may consider appropriate.
	28.8	Bids not opened and not read out at the Bid opening shall not be considered further for evaluation, irrespective of the circumstances. In particular, any discount offered by a Bidder which is not read out at Bid opening shall not be considered further.
	28.9	Bidders are advised to send in a representative with the knowledge of the content of the Bid who shall verify the information read out from the submitted documents. Failure to send a representative or to point out any un-read information by the





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		sent Bidder’s representative shall indemnify the <b>NBP</b> against any claim or failure to read out the correct information contained in the Bidder’s Bid.
	28.10	No Bid will be rejected at the time of Bid opening except for late Bids uploaded through EPADS, pursuant to ITB 24.
	28.11	The <b>NBP</b> shall prepare minutes of the Bid opening. The record of the Bid opening shall include, as a minimum: the name of the Bidder and whether or not there is a withdrawal, substitution or modification, the Bid price if applicable, including any discounts and alternative offers and the presence or absence of a Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration.
	28.12	The Bidders’ representatives who are present shall be requested to sign on the attendance sheet. The omission of a Bidder’s signature on the record shall not invalidate the contents and affect the record. A copy of the record shall be distributed to all the Bidders.
	28.13	A copy of the minutes of the Bid opening shall be furnished to individual Bidders upon request.
	28.14	In case of Single Stage Two Envelope Bidding Procedure, after the evaluation and approval of technical proposal the <b>NBP</b> , shall at a time within the bid validity period, publicly open the financial proposals of the technically accepted bids only. The financial proposal of bids found technically non-responsive shall be returned unopened to the respective bidders subject to redress of the grievances from all tiers of grievances.
<b>29. Confidentiality</b>	29.1	Information relating to the examination, clarification, evaluation and comparison of Bids and recommendation of contract award shall not be disclosed to Bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process until the time of the announcement of the respective evaluation report.
	29.2	Any effort by a Bidder to influence the <b>NBP</b> processing of Bids or award decisions may result in the rejection of its Bid.
	29.3	Notwithstanding <b>ITB 27.2</b> from the time of Bid opening to the time of contract award, if any Bidder wishes to contact the <b>NBP</b> on any matter related to the Bidding process, it should do so in writing or in electronic forms that provides record of the content of communication.
<b>30. 	30.3	The alteration or modification in THE BID which in any affect the following parameters will be considered as a change in the substance of a bid: a) Evaluation & qualification criteria. b) Required scope of work or specifications. c) All securities requirements. d) Tax requirements. e) terms and conditions of bidding documents. f) change in the ranking of the bidder



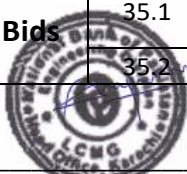
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	30.4	From the time of Bid opening to the time of Contract award if any Bidder wishes to contact the <b>NBP</b> on any matter related to the Bid it should do so in writing or in electronic forms that provide record of the content of communication.
<b>31. Preliminary Examination of Bids</b>	31.1	Prior to the detailed evaluation of Bids, the <b>NBP</b> will determine whether each Bid: a) meets the eligibility criteria defined in <b>ITB 3</b> and <b>ITB 4</b> . b) has been prepared as per the format and contents defined by the <b>NBP</b> in the Bidding Documents. c) has been properly signed. d) is accompanied by the required securities; and e) is substantially responsive to the requirements of the Bidding Documents. The <b>NBP's</b> determination of a Bid's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the Bid itself.
	31.2	A substantially responsive Bid is one which conforms to all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the Bidding Documents, without material deviation or reservation. A material deviation or reservation is one that: - a) affects in any substantial way the scope, quality, or performance of the Services; b) limits in any substantial way, inconsistent with the Bidding Documents, the <b>NBP's</b> rights or the Bidders obligations under the Contract; or presenting substantially responsive Bids. c) if rectified, would affect unfairly the competitive position of other Bidders presenting substantially responsive Bids.
	31.3	The <b>NBP</b> will confirm that the documents and information specified under ITB 11, 12 and 13 have been provided in the Bid. If any of these documents or information is missing or is not provided in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders, the Bid shall be rejected.
	31.4	The <b>NBP</b> may waive off any minor informality, nonconformity, or irregularity in a Bid which does not constitute a material deviation, provided such waiver does not prejudice or affect the relative ranking of any Bidder. <i>Explanation: A minor informality, non-conformity or irregularity is one that is merely a matter of form and not of substance. It also pertains to some immaterial defect in a Bid or variation of a bid from the exact requirements of the invitation that can be corrected or waived without being prejudicial to other bidders. The defect or variation is immaterial when the effect on quantity, quality, or delivery is negligible when contrasted with the total cost or scope of the supplies or services being acquired. The <b>NBP</b> either shall give the bidder an opportunity to cure any deficiency resulting from a minor informality or irregularity in a bid or waive the deficiency, whichever is advantageous to the <b>NBP</b>. Requesting information or documentation on such nonconformities shall not be related to any such aspect of the technical Proposal linked with the ranking of the bidders. Failure of the Bidder to comply with the request may result in the rejection of its Bid.



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	31.6	Provided that a Technical Bid is substantially responsive, the <b>NBP</b> shall rectify quantifiable nonmaterial nonconformities or omissions related to the Financial Proposal. To this effect, the Bid Price shall be adjusted, for comparison purposes only, to reflect the price of the missing or nonconforming item or component.
	31.7	If a Bid is not substantially responsive, it will be rejected by the <b>NBP</b> and may not subsequently be evaluated for complete technical responsiveness.
<b>32. Examination of Terms and Conditions; Technical Evaluation</b>	32.1	The <b>NBP</b> shall examine the Bid to confirm that all terms and conditions specified in the <b>GCC</b> and the <b>SCC</b> have been accepted by the Bidder without any material deviation or reservation.
	32.2	The <b>NBP</b> shall evaluate the technical aspects of the Bid submitted in accordance with <b>ITB 22</b> , to confirm that all requirements specified in <b>Section V – Schedule of Requirements, Technical Specifications</b> of the Bidding Documents have been met without material deviation or reservation.
	32.3	If after the examination of the terms and conditions and the technical evaluation, the <b>NBP</b> determines that the Bid is not substantially responsive in accordance with <b>ITB 29</b> , it shall reject the Bid.
<b>33. Correction of Errors</b>	33.1	Bids determined to be substantially responsive will be checked for any arithmetic errors.
